TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER and TEMPORARY INJUNCTION

The court has reviewed Plaintiff's Notice and Motion, and Complaint for Temporary Injunction and/or for Restraining Order and/or for Harassment Restraining Order/Injunction.

It appeared satisfactorily to the court that sufficient grounds exist for issuance of a temporary restraining order and temporary injunction per any or all of Wis. Statutes 813.02, 813.08, 813.125, and 893.76.

IT IS ORDERED:

1. Defendant, the Municipality of Janesville, is enjoined from proceeding with the condemnation order dated July 18, 2003, and extended to January 23, 2004, and is enjoined from razing of carriage house at 1402 West Court Street,
2. Defendant, the Municipality of Janesville, is enjoined from pursuing any currently pending condemnation actions or razing orders of citizen-held properties,
3. Defendant, the Municipality of Janesville, is enjoined from harassment of Plaintiff and must avoid the residences and any premises owned or occupied by Plaintiff pending a hearing before Judge John W. Roethe, scheduled for 02-04-04 at 1:15 p.m. in court room H, at the Rock County Court House, 51 South Main Street, Janesville, Wisconsin
